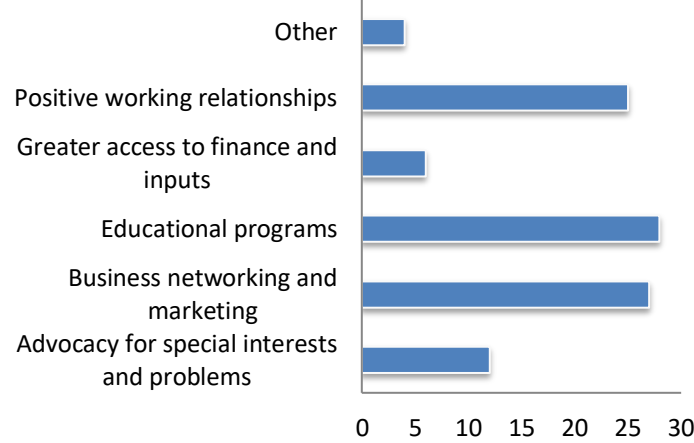
Are you a member of an agriculture group/organization?



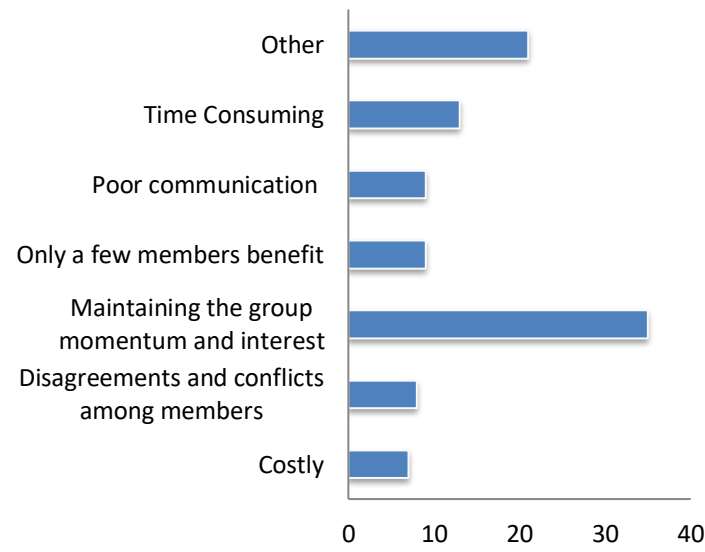
If YES, is being part of the group/organization beneficial to your agriculture enterprise?



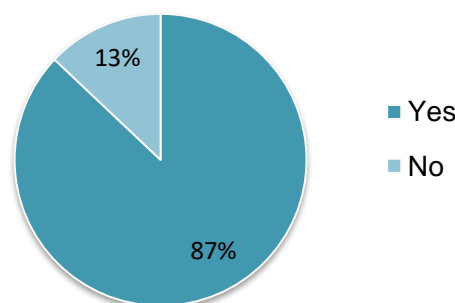
If YES, what are some of the benefits you enjoy being a member of an agriculture group/organization?



If YES, what are the main challenges you experience in using apps for you farming enterprise/work?

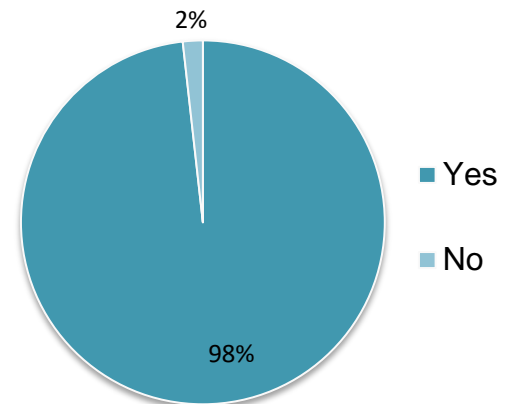


If NO, are you interested in joining an agriculture group/organization?

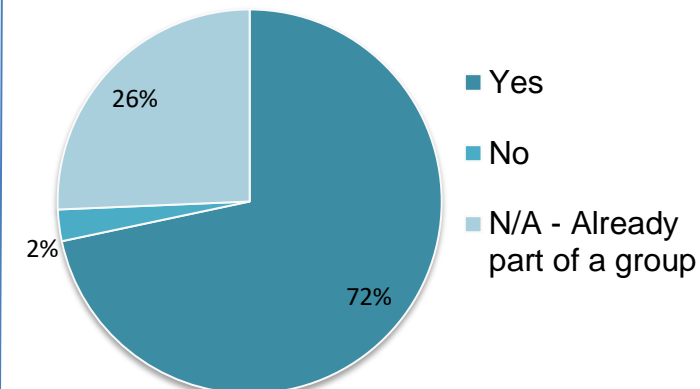

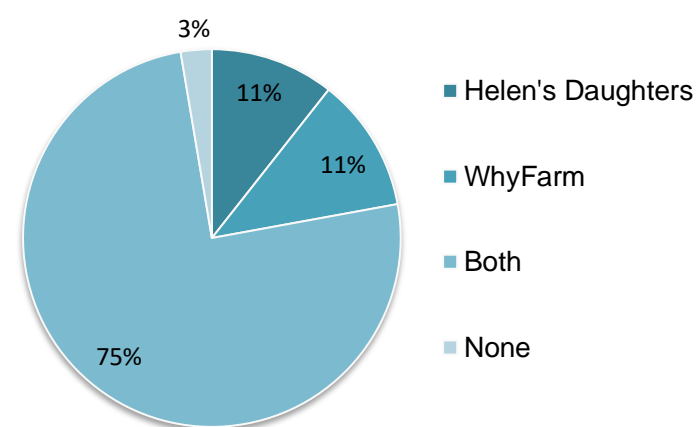
Do you feel that your knowledge on the development and functions of agriculture organizations have increased?
