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### Independent Auditors' Report

To the Inter-American Board of Agriculture  
of the Inter-American Institute for  
Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA)

We have audited the accompanying statements of financial position of the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA) as of December 31, 1999 and 1998, and the related statements of activities of unrestricted net assets, changes in net assets, and cash flows for the years then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the General Directorate of IICA. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audits.

We conducted our audits in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audits to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the General Directorate of IICA, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audits provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

The financial statements of IICA have been prepared in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles, except for recognition of obligations assumed during the year to acquire goods and services not yet received at the close of the respective year, established in accordance with accounting practices adopted by the Inter-American Board of Agriculture and incorporated into the Regulations of the General Directorate and the Financial Regulations, as indicated in note 1-l.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of IICA as of December 31, 1999 and 1998, and the results of its activities, changes in net assets, and cash flows for the years then ended, in conformity with the basis of accounting described in the preceding paragraph.

As of December 31, 1999, the balance of quotas due from Member States amounting to US\$9,223,825 (US\$6,388,552 in 1998) includes US\$1,812,208 (US\$1,047,912 in 1998) corresponding to outstanding quotas from 1998 and prior years. The General Directorate of IICA considers such balances to be collectible and is making efforts with each Member State to arrange specific terms for their collection.

Notes to the Financial Statements

December 31, 1999 and 1998

(1) Summary of organization, activities, and significant accounting policies

(a) Organization

The Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA) was organized in the District of Columbia, United States of America, on October 7, 1942 for an indefinite term. IICA is an autonomous Inter-American non-profit legal entity of Inter-American scope, the main objective of which is to stimulate, promote, and support the efforts of Member States to achieve agricultural development and rural well-being. Regulations and operating procedures were approved at the First Ordinary Meeting of the Inter-American Board of Agriculture held in Argentina in August 1981.

IICA has the following formal authority structures:

- Inter-American Board of Agriculture (IABA) comprised by a representative from each Member State.
- Executive Committee comprised by twelve Member States.
- General Directorate.

At present, IICA is made up of 34 Member States with central headquarters located in San José, Costa Rica.

(b) Funds managed by IICA

Funds managed by IICA are classified in the accompanying financial statements according to use restrictions established by donors as: Unrestricted Funds, Temporarily Restricted Funds, and Permanently Restricted Funds. Additionally, such funds are classified according to their source and purpose, as follows:

Unrestricted Funds

Regular Fund: This fund is comprised by two subfunds:

General Subfund: Activities of this fund are mainly financed by mandatory contributions from Member States, established by IABA, in accordance with the quota computation system of the Organization of American States (OAS). In addition, miscellaneous income is recorded in this fund. The purpose of the General Subfund is to finance execution of regular activities planned and budgeted by IICA, including administration and management.

Working Subfund: The purpose of this subfund is to ensure the normal financial operation of IICA. According to article 83 of General Directorate Regulations, the subfund balance shall not exceed 15% of annual quotas approved for the corresponding fiscal year, unless the Board makes specific provisions to the contrary. This fund is constituted by proceeds from the balances of uncommitted budget allocations at the end of each fiscal period and by additional funds specifically assigned by the Board (see note 7).

Fixed Assets Fund: The Fixed Assets Fund is used by IICA to control unrestricted property, furniture and equipment, which have been either acquired with resources from the Regular Fund or the Institutional Net Rate (INR) Fund or donated thereto by a national or international organization. The balance of the Fixed Assets Fund represents the carrying value, net of depreciation, of fixed assets owned by IICA, except for land with permanent use restrictions.

Institutional Net Rate (INR) Fund: The Inter-American Board of Agriculture in Resolution IICA/IABA/Res. 310 (IX-0/97), dated October 13, 1997, agreed to create the Institutional Net Rate Fund. The objective of this Fund is to finance additional costs incurred by IICA, in the execution of contracts, agreements, and grants subscribed with donors (Member States, international organizations, etc.) for specific purposes and to contribute to the Institute's pre-investment activities. The Institutional Net Rate Fund balance is composed of the recovery of Indirect Technical and Administrative Costs (Costos Administrativos y Técnicos Indirectos-CATIs) and Institutional Net Rates (Tasa Institucional Neta-TIN) in the management of projects executed by IICA with donor resources.

Patrimonial Fund: In Resolution IICA/IABA/Res. 299 (IX-0/97) dated October 13, 1997, the Inter-American Board of Agriculture agreed to create the Patrimonial Fund. The purpose of the Fund is to establish an endowment for partial financing of IICA's activities. The endowment is to be made up of donations and other voluntary contributions from governments, individuals, private institutions, and other donors, as well as a portion of the Fund's annual income deposited in the endowment to increase and preserve its real value. During the years ended December 31, 1999 and 1998, no contributions were made to this Fund.

The Fund's Capital Assets shall include all donated items of value, including, but not limited to: cash, stocks, bonds, notes, commercial paper, and other securities; real estate; intellectual property rights; licenses; royalty rights; liens, jewels, precious metals, and all other valuables, tangible and intangible. Capital Assets shall also include that portion of the Fund's annual income allocated to increase and maintain the value of Capital Assets.

Sixty percent of the Fund's net annual income shall be allocated to strengthening the Regular Fund budget of the Institute; the remainder is to be used to increase and maintain the real value of the Capital Assets of the Fund.

Capital Assets donated to the Fund, including all Fund income allocated to increase and maintain the real value of the Fund's Capital Assets, shall not be expended for a period of 20 years from the date of the resolution of the IABA creating the Fund.

Temporarily Restricted Funds:

Trust Funds: Trust Funds have been established according to contracts, agreements, and grants subscribed with donors (Member States, international organizations, etc.) for specific purposes. For control purposes, separate records are maintained to account for income and expenses related to those funds. Moreover, financial resources pertaining to some funds are managed through separate checking accounts according to donor requirements.

Simon Bolivar Special Fund for Agricultural Development: This fund is voluntary in nature, created to promote the activities of IICA and to accelerate agricultural and rural development in Latin America and the Caribbean. This fund is mainly financed by a special contribution from the Government of Venezuela and by contributions from other Member States.

IICA Associates Trust Fund: In Resolution IICA/IABA/Res. 312 (IX-0/97), dated October 13, 1997, the Inter-American Board of Agriculture approved the creation of the IICA Associates Trust Fund. IICA Associate Status is established for certain Permanent Observers, international, regional, and national organizations, and other non-IICA Member States. The Fund's balance is to be made up of contributions from such Associates, Member States and other donors to this Fund, and will be governed by the corresponding rules and regulations of the Institute and its Statutes approved by the Executive Committee. During the years ended December 31, 1999 and 1998, no contributions were made to this Fund.

Permanently Restricted Fund-Land

This fund is represented by the original contribution of land to IICA, which has permanent use restrictions (see note 4).

(c) Budget

A summary of significant aspects of the budget for each fund is provided below:

Regular Fund: On October 13, 1997, through Resolution IICA/IABA/Res. 296 (IX-0/97), the Inter-American Board of Agriculture (IABA) established the 1999 and 1998 budget for the Regular Fund made up of Member State quotas and other miscellaneous income amounting to US\$27,508,680 and US\$2,491,320, respectively, and agreed that no Member State is obligated to contribute over 59.47% of the total quota budget. Likewise, in the same resolution, IABA resolved to establish a Working Group composed of six Member States, with the task of collaborating with the Director General of IICA and with the Member States to define financing for the Regular Fund and the corresponding quota schedule for 1999, as well as the adjustments required for the 1999 Program Budget (see note 12).

The above resolution authorizes the Director General to transfer amounts between budget chapters not exceeding 10% of the total of each chapter.

Note 12, chart B, presents a comparative analysis of the budget authorized by IABA versus actual expenses and over or under execution.

**Trust Funds:** In resolution IICA/IABA/Res. 254 (VIII-0/95) dated September 19, 1995, IABA authorized the Director General to use the financial resources provided by institutions and Member States related to contracts, agreements, and grants. The above resolution authorized the Director General to accept contributions and donations, and to subscribe contracts or agreements, provided they are consistent with the objectives of IICA programs and that the Executive Committee of IICA is notified in advance of contracts or agreements exceeding US\$500,000.

(d) Monetary unit and foreign exchange regulations

The accounting records of IICA are kept in dollars of the United States of America (US\$) and the financial statements are expressed in such currency.

Assets and liabilities in currencies of countries where IICA activities are developed are translated into US dollars principally at official or commercial exchange rates in effect in each country. Transactions in such currencies are translated into US dollars using monthly average exchange rates. When determining its financial position and results of activities, IICA values and adjusts the balances of assets and liabilities that are recoverable or payable in the local currency of countries where activities are developed. The resulting differences are applied to the results of the period in which they are incurred.

(e) Trading securities

Trading securities are stated at cost, which approximates market value.

(f) Due from Regular Fund and Temporarily Restricted Net Assets

Funds contributed by institutions and Member States (donors) to establish Trust Funds for executing contracts, agreements, and grants are restricted contributions received from donors recorded as temporarily restricted net assets. As the amounts are used for the activities, IICA recognizes such funding as income from funds released from restrictions and Trust Fund expenses in the Statement of Activities of Unrestricted Net Assets when used in activities defined in the corresponding contracts, agreements, and grants. Generally, funds received from donors to execute contracts, agreements, and grants are managed by IICA as part of current assets of the Regular Fund. To identify the portion of funds corresponding to resources received from donors, two accounts are included under assets entitled "Due from Regular Fund by Trust Funds" and "Due from Regular Fund by the Simon Bolivar Special Fund for Agricultural Development".

If expenses incurred by IICA in the execution of a particular contract, agreement, or grant exceed the amounts contributed, the resulting difference is recorded as an account receivable from the respective donor.

(g) Inventories

Inventories are stated at average cost, which does not exceed market value.

(h) Allowance for doubtful accounts

According to IICA/IABA/Res. 109 (III-E/86) dated October 28, 1986, IICA adopted the policy of recording an allowance to value accounts receivable that present collection problems.

(i) Property, furniture, and equipment

IICA has adopted the policy of charging the amounts disbursed and/or committed for the acquisition of fixed assets to current period expenses, and subsequently capitalizing those amounts in the Fixed Assets Fund. Such capitalization is recorded at original acquisition cost of the asset or the market value in effect as of the donation date, if they are donated. Minor repairs and maintenance expenses are charged to results of the year's activities. Such practice enables IICA to compare expenditures with yearly budgeted amounts for the acquisition of fixed assets and, at the same time, to present such amounts as capitalized assets in the Statements of Financial Position.

(j) Accumulated depreciation

The historical cost (or appraisal) of fixed assets is depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets by the straight-line method. Fully depreciated assets still in use are maintained at a book value of US\$1,00, for control purposes.

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(k) Provisions

According to the organization's regulations, IICA must absorb expenses for repatriation and recognition of years of service of international professional personnel, in the case of resignation or dismissal; such expenses are computed for each official based on the employment period and on the number of dependents. Likewise, local personnel are entitled to similar benefits once they no longer work for IICA. To cover expected disbursements for such items, IICA has adopted the policy of recording provisions related therewith, entitled "Repatriation of International Professional Personnel", "Recognition of Years of Service for International Professional Personnel", and "Recognition of Years of Service for Local Personnel".

In accordance with legislation in effect in each country where IICA offices are located, local personnel are entitled to severance indemnities based on years of continuous service. IICA follows the policy of recording an accrual for severance indemnities to cover disbursements related therewith.

(l) Closing obligations

In conformity with its Financial Regulations, IICA follows the practice of recognizing obligations in its financial statements that are assumed during the year to acquire goods and services not yet received at year-end.

Provisions regulating the recording of such liabilities are included in standards No. 2.13 and 2.14 entitled "Recording and Control of Obligations" and "Disbursements", respectively, which establish that obligations to acquire goods and assets that are pending at the close of each fiscal year shall be included as part of total expenses for that year and should be recorded as accounts payable at the close of the same year. Those standards also establish that budgetary allocations should be made to comply with payments of all obligations incurred during the fiscal year, as well as obligations approved prior to the close of the fiscal year which will be carried forward to the following year or years for their corresponding settlement. In the latter case, the aforementioned standards of the Financial Regulations indicate that such budgetary allocations should remain available for up to two years after the date of the close of the fiscal year in which the obligations were incurred and approved. Upon termination of such period, allocations expire and the remaining obligations should be eliminated by transferring the respective funds to the Working Subfund of the Regular Fund.

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Notes to the Financial Statements

General accepted accounting principles require the accounting or recognition of provisions when: a) An entity has a current obligation as a result of a past event; b) It is probable that funds will be disbursed to settle the obligation and; c) A reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

As of December 31, 1999, approximately 42.85% (57% in 1998) of such obligations are related to commitments established on CATI/TIN Funds, Trust Funds, and miscellaneous income.

(m) Net Assets - Restricted and Unrestricted Funds

Beginning December 31, 1995, IICA adopted the new accounting standards contained in Financial Accounting Standards (FASB) No. 116 and 117. In accordance with those standards, IICA records contributions received from donors for specific purposes, as well as any income generated by such contributions, as Net Assets - Temporarily Restricted Funds. The balance of each Temporarily Restricted Fund decreases when available resources are used for established purposes, and is disclosed as "net assets released from restrictions due to satisfaction of project restrictions" in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets and as "Trust Funds released from restrictions" in the Statements of Activities of Unrestricted Net Assets.

The balance of Unrestricted Funds increases with the excess of income over expenses from IICA's miscellaneous activities (increase in unrestricted net assets), as determined at the end of each year. Likewise, such balance decreases when there is an excess of expenses over income (decrease in unrestricted net assets).

(n) Income from Member State quotas

According to IABA resolutions, IICA follows the policy of recording assessed quotas as receivable from Member States on the first day of the corresponding fiscal year. According to article 80 of IICA's Financial Regulations, such quotas are collectible as of that date.

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Notes to the Financial Statements

**(o) Recovery of Indirect Technical and Administrative Costs (CATIs)**

As established in certain contract agreements signed by IICA with donors (Member States, international organizations, etc.), IICA collects a percentage of total direct costs incurred in execution from trust funds in order to reimburse IICA costs incurred in managing those contracts. Such reimbursement is recognized by IICA as income when earned and increases the balance of the Institutional Net Rate (INR) Fund.

**(2) Restricted cash**

Cash in banks includes funds held in separate bank accounts which may only be used to cover expenditures related to contracts signed by IICA and the respective donors.

Property, furniture and equipment do not include fixed assets acquired with resources from special funds (Trust Funds), since such disbursements are considered expenditures related to the execution of specific agreements related to those funds. However, in accordance with the provisions of each agreement, when assets are donated, exchanged, or sold to IICA, they are recognized in the accounting records as part of the Fixed Assets Fund.

The Tropical Agriculture Research and Training Center (CATIE) was granted usufruct rights to land and buildings located in Turrialba and Limon, Costa Rica, according to an agreement subscribed between the Government of Costa Rica and IICA.

Land located in San Isidro de Coronado, Costa Rica, was donated to IICA by the Government of Costa Rica. However, once IICA concludes its official mission or terminates its functions in Costa Rica, the property and any improvements thereto shall be returned to the Government of Costa Rica. Income capitalized for this donation is shown in the financial statements of IICA as part of Net Assets – Permanently Restricted Funds.

(7) Tropical Agriculture Research and Training Center (CATIE)

The Tropical Agriculture Research and Training Center (CATIE), headquartered in Turrialba, Costa Rica, is a non-profit, scientific, and educational organization. Based on article 21 of the contract which created CATIE, the Inter-American Board of Agriculture (IABA), through resolution IICA/IABA/Res. 14 (I-0/81), dated August 13, 1981, authorized the Director General of IICA to formally propose the termination of such contract, which was to expire on June 30, 1985. Additionally, the Director General was assigned, in counsel with the Government of Costa Rica, to analyze and prepare alternatives for institutional reorganization and future CATIE policies, to be formalized in a new contract. In October 1982, the Inter-American Board of Agriculture approved a new contract for CATIE, ratified by the Government of Costa Rica through Law No. 6873 dated July 5, 1983. Subsequently, the Board approved certain amendments thereto through resolution IICA/JIA/Res. 107 (III-E/86).

The principal terms of the new contract are as follows:

- a) The Inter-American Board of Agriculture will be CATIE's highest governing body;
- b) IICA is to make contributions to the basic activities budget of CATIE, up to an amount equivalent to 5% of the total annual quotas of IICA;
- c) The new contract shall be effective for a 20-year term from the date on which the Government of Costa Rica approves the contract. Such period may be extended for equal consecutive terms; and
- d) Upon termination of the contract, all assets in use by CATIE and improvements thereto shall be returned to IICA. The remaining assets will be distributed to IICA, the Government of Costa Rica, and the regular active members, proportionate to their contributions.

During the years ended December 31, 1999 and 1998, IICA contributed the amounts of US\$1,000,000 and US\$1,293,600, respectively, to CATIE, in accordance with the allocation in the corresponding Program Budget.

(8) Disbursements subject to approval

Some grant agreements subscribed with international organizations, included in note 12, chart C, establish that disbursements for agreed-upon programs executed with grant funds are subject to approval or rejection by those same organizations, depending on compliance with the terms of each agreement.

(9) Taxes

As a non-profit international organization, IICA is exempt from income and sales taxes in Costa Rica and other countries where it operates. With respect to other taxes, such as contributions and present or future national and municipal taxes, customs duties, national licenses, among others, the exemption is dependent upon the agreements subscribed with the Governments of those countries.

(10) Restatement of financial statements

In 1999, as part of the review and analysis of accounts related to various agreements administered by the Cooperation Agency of Brazil, which was performed in response to weaknesses determined in the internal control system in such Agency, the Institute determined that in 1996 an item amounting to US\$489,653 was included by error as part of miscellaneous income in the Regular Fund. Such amount corresponded to income assignable to one of the Trust Funds administered by the aforementioned Cooperation Agency, which was subsequently reported to the respective donor and made available for execution of activities corresponding to the Trust Fund. As a result of the error, the value of income of such Trust Fund and the balance of Net Assets of Trust Funds were understated. Additionally, the balance of the General Subfund of the Regular Fund was overstated by the same amount. Consequently, the Institute decided to correct the situation retroactively, modifying the 1996, 1997, and 1998 financial statements as follows:

**(11) Contingencies**

As of December 31, 1999, IICA had filed lawsuits against two banks in Guatemala for paying four checks amounting to a total of Q1,300,000 quetzals (approximately US\$168,000), which had been removed illegally from the Cooperation Agency in such country. Additionally, one of those banks filed a countersuit against IICA for Q800,000 quetzales (approximately US\$104,000). According to IICA legal counsel in Guatemala, there is a high probability that this suit will be settled in favor of IICA. Additionally, IICA has recorded a provision for the amount of US\$119,403 to cover possible future losses related therewith.

Additionally, as of the same date, several labor lawsuits have been filed against IICA through the Cooperation Agencies in Brazil, Colombia, Paraguay, Venezuela, and Uruguay. According to legal advisors, there is not an important risk that the Institute may incur in commitments related to these matters.

As of December 31, 1999, IICA has not included a provision in the financial statements to cover future obligations or losses resulting from the final resolution of the above litigation.
