The IICA Representatives in the countries provided support for the Ministerial Delegates of Agriculture and for them in their dealings with the National Summits Coordinators at the ministries of foreign affairs.

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		IICA set up an electronic system so that the Ministerial Delegates could take part in the Hemispheric Dialogue. The objectives were to reach consensus on the AGRO 2003-2015 Plan and work on a Ministerial Proposal for the Special Summit aimed at consolidating the support of the Heads of State and Government for the improvement of agriculture and rural life in the Americas. IICA maintained close communication with all the Delegates and facilitated their participation in the virtual hemispheric dialogue.
	2. To express appreciation to the partner institutions of the Summit process (OAS, ECLAC, IICA, IDB, World Bank and PAHO) as well as to other international organizations, such as IFPRI, FAO and CATIE, for their joint efforts in support of the Ministerial Delegates' work to prepare the products of the Second Ministerial Meeting, and to our countries, for fulfilling the mandates.	On several occasions, special visits were made to the headquarters of all the organizations mentioned, to elicit their support for the 2003 ministerial process. ECLAC, PAHO, the OAS, IFPRI, and CATIE responded positively. These organizations made important contributions with regard to the evolution of agriculture and rural life that were incorporated into the document entitled "State of and Outlook for Agriculture and Rural Life in the Americas."

The results spurred the Ministerial Delegates who had
		been unable to attend the GRICA meeting to participate

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		more actively in the virtual dialogue. The GRICA met again on the day before the start of the Second Ministerial Meeting in Panama, and continued to meet through 11 November, when it finally reached a consensus on the AGRO 2003-2015 Plan. Thus, the ministers of agriculture approved the AGRO 2003-2015 Plan based on the full, participatory discussions involving their Ministerial Delegates.
