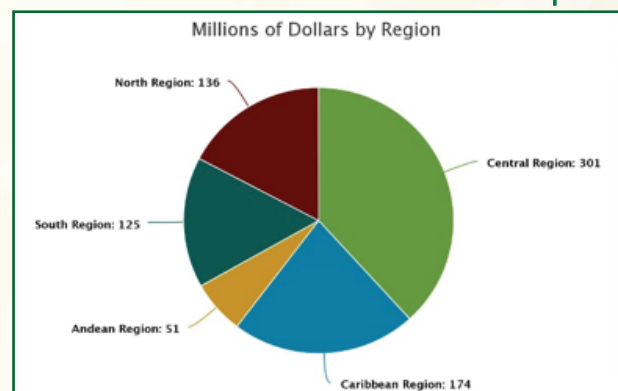
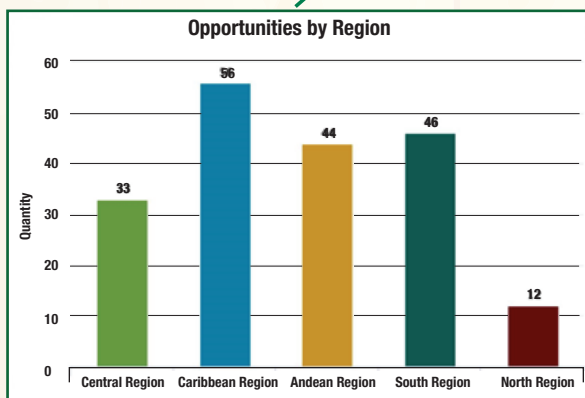

Winrock International and IICA–strategic partnership
